

## 2014 LRCA HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

**George Chambers**-became a member of the Louisiana Rodeo Cowboys Association in 1974. He served as Team Roping Director for 4 years and then as Vice President for 5 years. He was the finals champion team roper five consecutive years 1981, 82, 83, 84 and 85. He retired as a Bossier City Fire Fighter after serving 24 years. He has been associated and now owns Ranchland Bossier for 34 years. He was married to the late Debbie Rowland Chambers for 32 years and is now married to his wonderful wife LaRene Chambers.

**Custer Coleman**- 11 time LRCA finalist in the bull riding, 1980 Bull Riding Champion, Reserve Champion LRCA Bull Rider 4 times; the first one to ride Bull 99 of Sonny Lewis's, scoring 90 points.

**Mike DeMoss**-father of Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association NFR Saddle Bronc Riding Qualifiers Cody and Heith Demoss. The boys got their riding ability honestly, their father is a 2 time Louisiana High School Rodeo Association Bareback Riding Champion; 2 time National High School Rodeo Association Bareback Riding Champion; Multi year LRCA finals qualifier and champion; International Professional Rodeo Association Finals Bareback Riding Qualifier 3 years

**Steve Duhon**- was the son of a horse trainer and part-time rodeo contestant. He became interested in horses when he was 5 years old. In high school he played football and pursued his interest in rodeo becoming the Louisiana High School Rodeo and National High School Rodeo Association Steer Wrestling and All Around Champion multiple times. After high school Steve played football at Louisiana State University in 1981 and 1982. After two years with the Tigers, Steve decided to pursue his rodeo career. This choice led to him becoming the LRCA Steer Wrestling Average and Year End Champion before moving on to the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association. In 1985 Steve was Resistol Rookie of the Year in the PRCA. The next year, he won the first of three world championships. World Championships: 3 (1986-87, 1993) Along the way to those championships, he qualified for the National Finals Rodeo nine times, twice won the steer wrestling NFR aggregate title and established a Wrangler NFR record run of 3.0 seconds in 1986, a mark that was tied in 2001. In 2003 he was inducted into the Pro Rodeo Hall of Fame and tonight he is being inducted into the Louisiana Rodeo Cowboys Hall of Fame, which he considers a special honor since his dad helped found the LRCA.

**Mike Fletcher**- Mike competed for 29 years beginning in high school. He won the Louisiana State High Rodeo Association Saddle Bronc Riding Championship in 1973 and then went on to win the National High School Rodeo Association Saddle Bronc Riding Championship the same year. He began to compete in the Louisiana Rodeo Cowboys Association where he competed in the Bareback and Saddle Bronc Riding winning the event average and championships as well as the all round. In 1983, he won the IPRA Saddle Bronc Riding and all-around championships. These days it's his "Spur On Country Church" near Mineola that gives him the most satisfaction.

**J.W. Hollis, Jr.**-was a member of the LRCA for 25 years during which time he served as the Team Roping director for four years. He won the average in the team roping in 1975, 79, and 81. He currently stays connected with rodeo and the LRCA as a successful farrier shoeing a number of the contestant's horses.

**Randy Mathews**-began as a bull rider while working for Mr. Sonny Lewis. He was the Louisiana Rodeo Cowboys Association bull riding average champion. After he quit riding bulls he continued his rodeo career as both a bull fighter and funny man for many years.

**Ginny Perry**-has been a member of the LRCA for more than 20 years, even before Ladies Breakaway was a sanctioned event. She was very instrumental helping to get Ladies Breakaway as an Event in the LRCA, having served as the Breakaway Director for 11 or 12 years. She has competed in the LRCA finals for 22 consecutive years--winning the LRCA Breakaway title 4 times and several reserve titles. She won the Tri-State Rodeo Association Breakaway Title 5 times and the North American Rodeo Commission world title once. She also competed in the WPRCA finals -- competing in Tie-down Calf Roping and Team Roping, and winning the finals All Around Champion. Ginny met and made many life-long friends through Roping and Rodeoing. She has been blessed to rope with some of the best in the business. Ginny is honored and very proud to be a part of Louisiana Rodeo Cowboys Association and has always called the LRCA her home. Thank You for the Hall of Fame Honor--and who knows you may see her back Roping next season!

**David Porter**-began his career early and continued to compete and make the LRCA finals for four decades, the 70's, 80's, 90's and 2000. David was the LRCA Team Roping and All Around champion in 1979 and 1983. He also won the All Around title in 1982 and 1987. He was also the calf roping champion in 1987 and 1992.

**Punkee Schroeder**-former Louisiana Rodeo Cowboys Association Champion Bull Rider
